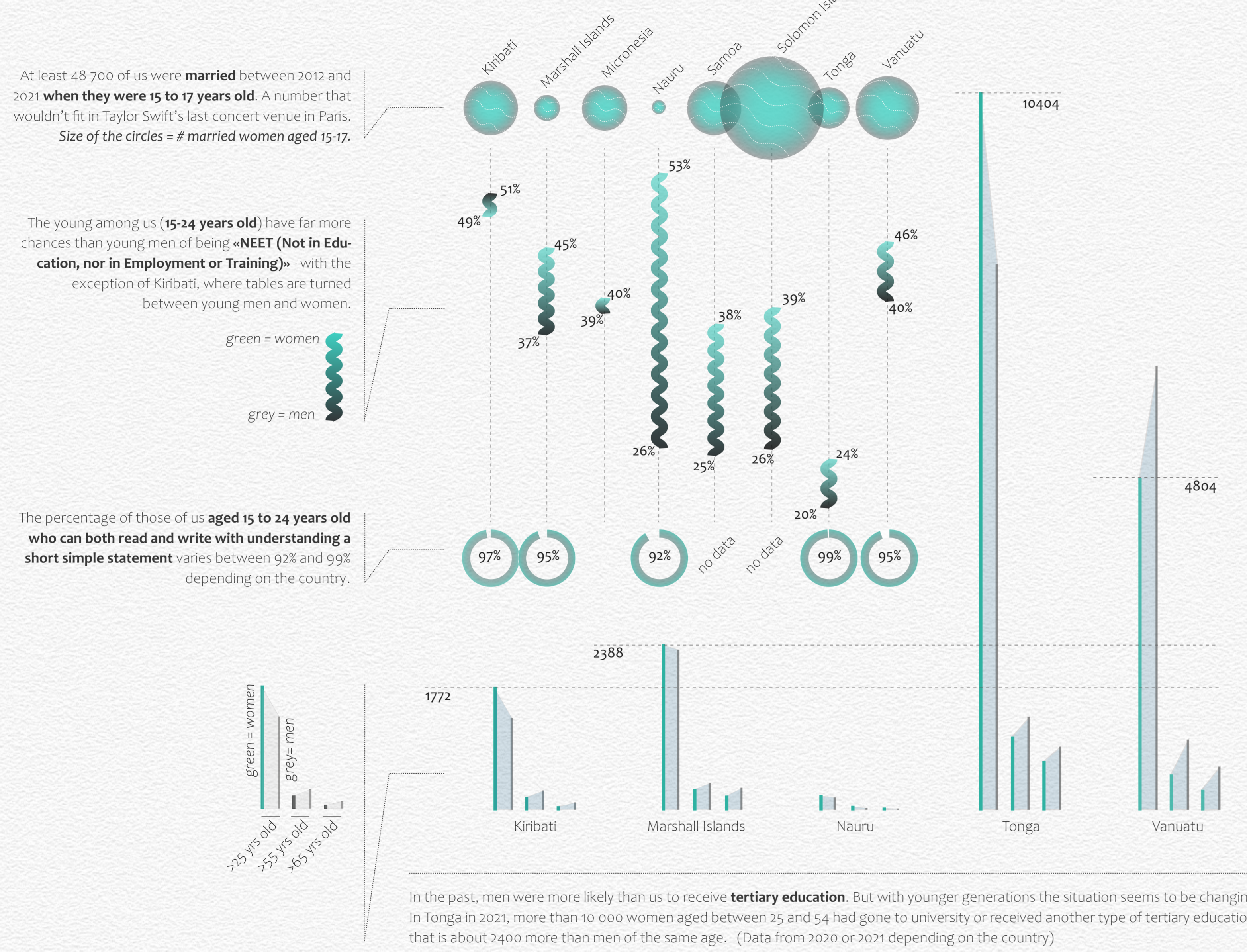
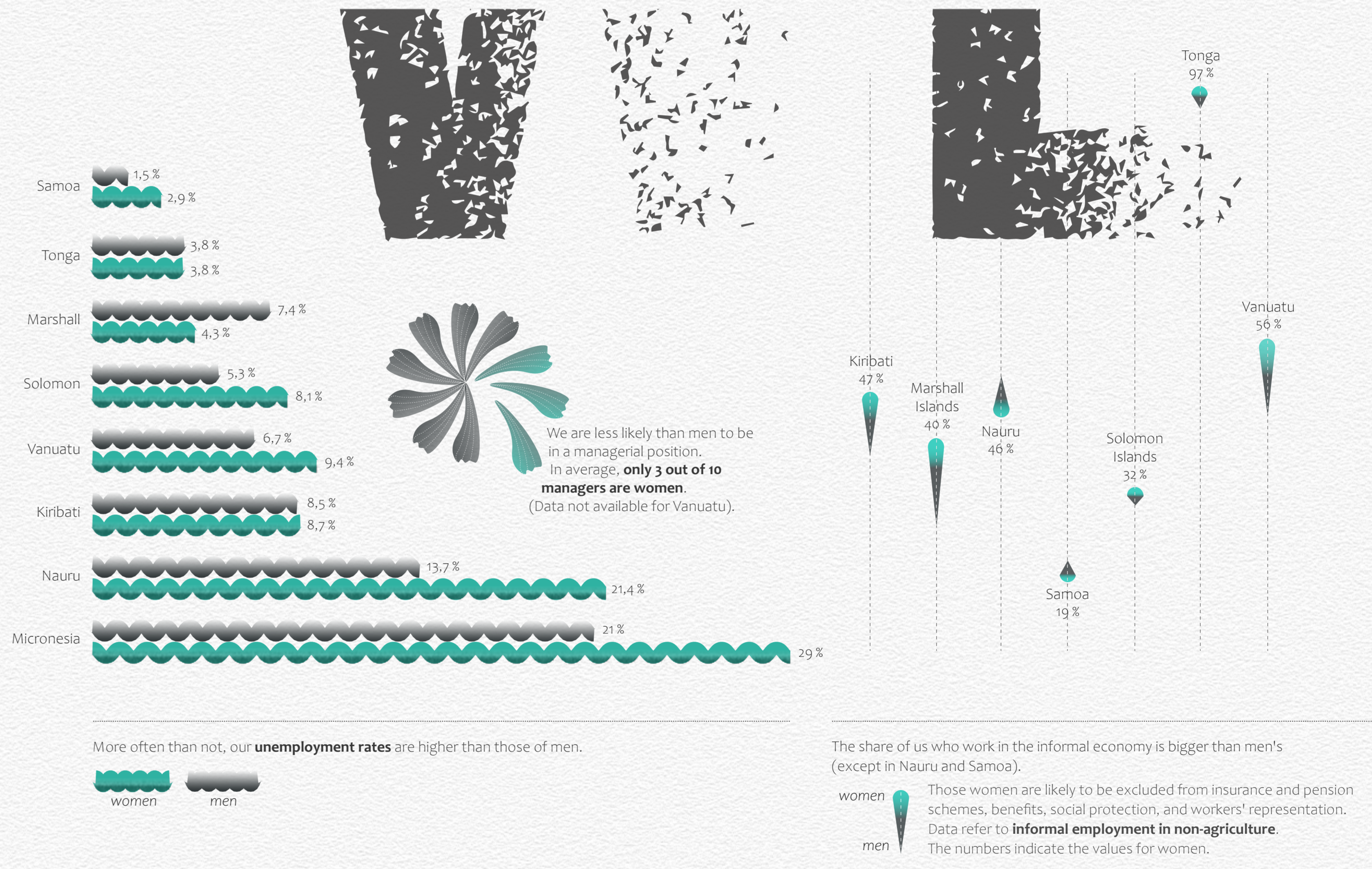


This visual is an attempt to provide a glimpse into the lives of women in 8 Pacific Islands States through the data made available by the Pacific Data Hub. The 8 countries portrayed here are: Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga and Vanuatu, through years ranging from 2012 to 2021 depending on the country and on the indicator.

As for me, the author of this visualization, I'm a white European woman who's never had the chance of visiting anyone of these countries. I studied this data like someone who looks at a picture from a place far away and tries to retrace patterns, people and emotions in it, imagining how it would be like to be there, among them, listening to their stories. What would they tell?

This data visualization was created as an entry for the Pacific Dataviz Challenge 2024, which was on the theme of «gender (in)equality». The available data for the competition was quite scattered, with available years varying from 2012 to 2021 depending on the country and on the indicator. For this reason, the visualizations above were built using, for each indicator, the data for the last available year for each country even if it may not be the same year for all the countries. Inevitably, this provides a less precise picture than what could be achieved with a more complete dataset, but I do hope that it will still be an insightful and useful conversation starter about gender equality in the Pacific region.
