The graph shows significant disparities in beach litter density. Tonga is by far the most affected, with approximately 8 million pieces of litter per km², followed by New Caledonia, Samoa, and French Polynesia. Other islands, such as Kiribati, have very low levels of pollution. This underscores the urgency of taking local action where the impact is greatest.
